BROWN BAG BIBLE STUDY STARTS UP WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 7TH

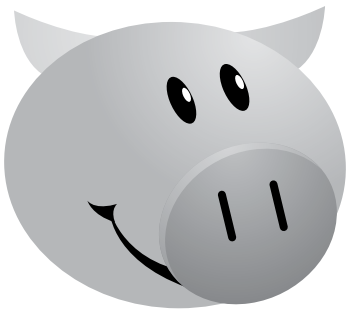

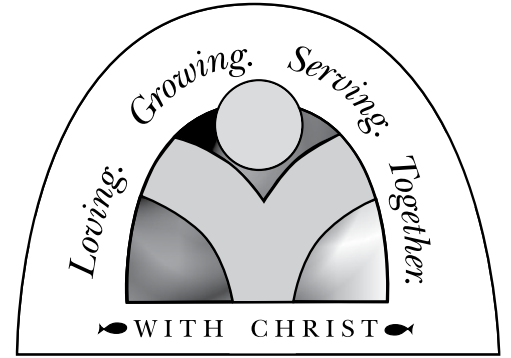

Message from the Pastor – September 2016

Over the last couple of weeks the lectionary has given us texts that encourage us to look at conflict and how we embrace or avoid it. We have talked about staying present even when things get really rough and scary and maintaining a curious exploration so that we might hear the deepest truth of one another's heart.

I suspect that the transition between acquaintances and deep, lasting friendship is fostered by surviving a conflict. When we pass through a conflict together we learn that we care enough to stay present through the really difficult conversations and having established this trust we can lean into the relationship with our whole selves, daring to be vulnerable, to share our deepest truths, because we know that the relationship is held with gentleness and love, that the relationship is valued above the desire to 'be right.'

None of this means that conflict is easy. For most of us it's frightening and the temptation to avoid it, either by steamrolling over those who disagree or by withdrawing completely, is pretty strong. One of the goals of your session and leadership is to create a safe place to hear each other's views, value the differences and find that creative place where conflict and vulnerability engage.

How we handle conflict reflects our values, it reflects our heart. I believe that if Jesus came to kindle the fires of conflict it was because he loved our passionate discipleship and knew that following his path would place us in conflict with our habitual ways of being, and with the ways of the world. If we love and love deeply we must create space to hear one another with kindness, with compassion and we must not retreat or manage by fiat.

In order to live into this reality we have decided to host two listening sessions around the question of whether we ought to have flags in the sanctuary or not. We want to hear from you how this question has been living inside of you, what issues it raises for you, what values and needs are asking for attention and recognition in you. In order to do this your leadership will host two listening sessions concerning this issue. We ask that you come with the intention of creating a safe place for people to express whatever is on their hearts, that we listen with love and gentleness.

We remember that Jesus never asked us to be right, he asked us to love one another. Through long processes of schooling we have all been taught to give the right answer and so the temptation is to find the right answer and then defend it, but I ask you not to, but rather to speak about what is on your heart and create space for others to do the same.

These listening sessions are scheduled for September 21 and October 10th at 6:30 p.m. Please extend an invitation to anyone who might be interested in either the issue of flags in the sanctuary or in alternative methods of dealing with conflict.

Most of the letters that Paul wrote were to congregations involved in conflict. We know that the church has a long history of conflict and how we manage our conflicts tells the broader community about us, who we are and how we are actively pursuing the kingdom of God. So while the temptation is to avoid conflict, I am hopeful that we will take a moment to be grateful for this opportunity to show the world how we love one another, how we welcome diverse points of view, and that here, when we welcome someone, we welcome every bit of them, even or perhaps especially those parts of them that challenge us.

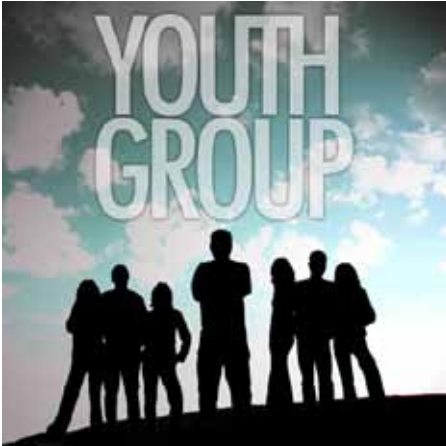
