## Message from Pastor Cyndi: Burning Brightly in the New Year

My Friends,

We are living in an era when the safety net that most of us grew up with is being dismantled. We hear stories of people trying to fund necessary medical care through GoFundMe campaigns and of people trying to ration their insulin. The freedoms that our service men and women fought for are being dismantled. These are difficult times and it can be tempting to give into feelings of powerlessness and despair. It can be tempting to wonder what anyone of us can really do. Can we make a difference? Margaret Mead reminds us that:

Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful, committed citizens can change the world; indeed, it's the only thing that ever has.

We remember that even though Jesus had 12 disciples, he sent them out in twos and threes. Small groups of people who went into small towns and changed lives. Into the meanness and poverty of an oppressed people, they came speaking words of hope, life, and love. The darkness is still with us. The light did not consume it, did not extinguish all darkness.

While I often wish that the darkness had been forever dispelled, I also remember that life often begins in the dark. Whether it is the seed buried in soft soil, or a child beginning to move and kick in the darkness of the womb. Life, like grace, begins in the dark, but it doesn't stay there.

In this new year, we are invited to burn more brightly the darker and more difficult times become. We are invited keep a watchful eye out for those who are hurting, lost, and alone. We are called to keep the biblical mandate to care for the stranger among us, providing deep, deep hospitality. We remember that the light that came into the world, came into the darkness and it can still be found there, still shining, still being passed from one person to another, wherever love is found.

We are so fortunate and blessed to live in Lodi, to know the security of family, friends, and community. We know the experience of being loved and cared for. This year I invite you to make a practice of finding one person, one charity, one place, where this is not so. One person or place where insecurity threatens, where fear feels valid and strong, and walk with them. Be with them. Watch over them. I invite you to practice awareness and presence simply by noticing and allowing the fear and pain of one person or one place to touch your heart. I invite you to let compassion burn brightly within you, let it remake you and transform you.

We are not called to be the church only for our own salvation, but for the salvation of all the world. We remember this every time we pray together, "Thy Kingdom come, on earth as it is heaven." We are invited, called, to participate in the coming of the Kingdom of God, one person, one place, one situation at a time. We are called to be a city on a hill, burning so brightly that all might see the light and take hope.

Let us burn brightly in the New Year, that all people might see the light of Christ burning within us!

# SCRIP

I challenge you to see if there are at least 5 different vendors that you could use scrip for.....visit [www.shopwithscrip.com](http://www.shopwithscrip.com) to find the list of the over 700 vendors to see if you use them. If you do not use a computer, I have them printed in a binder so you can look through it after church too.

There are physical cards (that you need to wait about a week to get and have shipping costs to the order) AND there are ONLINE E-CARDS (called ScripNow) that go directly to your online shopwithscrip account (that are received within minutes of the order being placed and have NO shipping costs).

You can send the online cards AS A GIFT through emails also--this includes a special note from you

and you can choose when it is sent (specific date...like Christmas or birthday).

You can also pull up these online cards with your phone and pay retailers directly from your phone--they scan your barcode right from your phone (no paper, no waiting).

You can even pay for your order directly from your checking account with PRESTO PAY....for any kind of card (physical or online)...and it only costs 15 cents a transaction. No more running around to get a check to someone! Convenient!

A lot of physical cards can be kept and RELOADED anytime payment is received (by check or PrestoPay). We use them for our gas cards because we shop for gas at the BP gas stations. There is one is each vehicle (red van, black van and red truck) and whoever has it can pull it out of

the glove box and use it at the pump. Another example is Subway cards. Each person has there own because we are not always together when we eat there. I load these monthly or biweekly when we need them or when Paul gets paid, which ever is needed.

A person using scrip made this comment, "We didn't spend a dime more than we normally would have on gas, groceries, dining out and gift giving. It is basically free money. Why wouldn't people do this? It's an awesome way to help out!"--Doreen W. I agree with her, there are so many reasons get started on using the Scrip Program!! Start today!! Call me with any questions about getting you started or using it more than you have in the past!
