My friends,

When I preached in the aftermath of the shootings at Mother Immanuel, one of my deepest griefs was that Dylan Roof was one of us. I suppose it shouldn't have mattered, but learning that he grew up in a church like I did, going to Sunday school, singing in worship, fellowshipping at the potlucks, somehow it all made it that much worse. I couldn't help but wonder how he failed to learn that all people carry the image of God and are deserving of love and respect.

Somehow we, his culture, his church, those who loved him, failed to give him the tools and understanding to deal in a healthy way with rejection and race. We failed to communicate that all people are beloved children of God and worthy of respect and care. I am still chilled by his saying to the bible study group he'd joined at this historic black church, "you seem like nice people" before he shot them. Dylan Roof learned about race and gender relations online in forums where his complaint that a black man stole his girlfriend was met with sympathy and a call for a race war. His anger and perceived victimization was stoked in these forums.

This week we witnessed youth from the Covington Catholic school behave in ways that must have made their parents, their teachers, their priests cringe. We know now, as more of the story comes out, that they were provoked by a few men who hurled racial and homophobic slurs at them. They appeared to be completely unprepared to handle this in a way that would sustain healthy community. I wonder if we failed them.

Our churches have become quieter and quieter about such divisive issues as race, gender, civil discourse, and sexuality. Into the void that the church's silence has left, social media and public opinion has cheerfully stepped. This deeply saddens me as our faith has a story and a theology of the sacred that is sorely lacking in our world.

The church must not be silent on divisive issues for the church has a word that only the church can speak. The church must speak to the sacred nature of our relationships, our inter-connectedness, our call to be a blessing, to lift up the downtrodden, to empower the oppressed, to heal the wounded, to love one another, yes, even our enemies. When the church fails to speak on these issues, someone else will. And no matter how well intentioned, if they speak from a place of no-faith, they will not mention that there is that about us, about each other, about how we relate to one another, especially in highly conflicted or intimate settings, that is sacred.

Another event that occurred this weekend was the celebration at St. Peter's Catholic Church in Cameron, Wisconsin of the return of Jayme Closs after her 3 months in captivity and the death of her parents. I hope that if they did not address the sacred nature of Jayme's family relationships and of her very being, that they will do so soon. I hope that they will address the toxic masculinity that caused her attacker to feel justified in killing her parents and abducting her. I hope that they will renew their awareness of the messages they are sending their youth, just in case it's not what they really want to say.
