Faithful in Small Things

Our lives are not about ourselves. We are called to live in such a way that our love for God and for our neighbor, who may not look like us, speak the same language, or make us feel good, is evident in all things. This is a counter-cultural way of living that is true to the gospel of Jesus Christ. We are not called to build ourselves up, but to lift those around us. We are not called to have the finest church building or the most dramatic worship, but to love the least of these as much as we can. The scarcity mentality of our common culture will tell us that there isn't enough and won't ever be enough and we ought to get ours while the getting is good, but the gospel of Jesus Christ calls us to live a whole hearted courageous life.

The world will be quick to tell you that there isn't enough to go around, not enough love, not enough money, not enough housing, not enough, not enough, with the corollary quickly following that you'd better get yours while the getting is good. This ethic, this fear demonstrates a lack of faithful trust in God's providence. It drives unhealthy, self-serving behavior and it cannot be satisfied by accumulation. No matter how much you get, it will never be enough to satisfy the fear of scarcity.

In our scripture this month we heard the story of the unfaithful steward. This man lived a self-serving, self-satisfied life right up until he learned he was being fired and losing his comfortable position. At first glance this might seem like a tragedy, but I believe this was a blessing. The steward's eyes were opened to the deeper truth that we belong to one another. He was drawn into community through his manipulative, desperate acts of grace and forgiveness.

What will it take to shake us loose from our fearful grasping? What I know from my own experience is that when I make decisions from a place of fear and scarcity I almost always make bad decisions. I know that, for myself, I must take the time to rest in God's grace and love before I return to any decision. When I place my trust in God's providence, new ways forward appear. This year as I experience a financial shortfall and realize that I may not be able to keep my home, the cost of renovations, even as I do my own work, is more than I can handle, I realize that I am being called into solidarity with those in our community who are also housing-insecure. I realize that I can trust God to show up for me even when things are tough and it's cold outside. I realize that God is shaking me loose from my own fearful grasping and there is deep grace in this.

Where are the places in your life that God is seeking to shake you loose? Where has fear taken a grip on your life? These are the places that are fresh and ready for transformation, for re-vitalization. We are called to step boldly into the places of our fear, not alone, but with one another, with God, trusting that we will be made new. These fears are often monetary, but not always. Sometimes they are fears that we will not be liked, or that we won't be able to achieve our dreams, that we aren't good enough, smart enough, brave enough.

In a world where fears of scarcity dominate our worldview, hear these good words: You are enough. You have enough. You are not alone. God calls us to live from a different place, not one of self-focused scarcity, but one of self-giving, God-trusting, neighbor-loving grace and love. Our lives are not about ourselves. Our church is not the mission, our church has a mission. We are called to live in such a way that God's love is evident in us, through us, and points always back to God. We cannot do this from a place of fear and scarcity. We can only do this when we center our lives on God's grace and love. Be bold. Be brave, and trust in God. We are enough. We have enough. We are not alone.

The full financial statements are always available upon request, but we wanted everyone to be able to take a glance and see how we are doing. We are fortunate to have been 'in the black' the last couple of years. We have a conservative and dedicated financial team as well as your faithful giving to thank for that.

We publish our weekly giving in the bulletin each week, but this can be misleading. Sometimes our givers do so early in one big lump sum, other times they miss a few weeks and make up for it later.

Although it make look concerning that we have not made our budget and are in the negative at this time, this is something that your finance committee has taken into consideration and expected. We do have funds including endowments which some of the saints of the church designated in their will to sustain the church. Many of these funds are kept in investments or are designated for specific uses. This is a legacy we have been given from those who came before us that we honor and maintain for the good of the church.

ECO-CORNER
