My friends,

We are all created in the image of God. Created in relationship for relationship; created in love, for love. Psychologists call this process 'mirroring" we learn who we are by seeing others mirror back to us our worth, our value. If we are fortunate enough to have what psychologists call a "good enough" parent, we will know we are loved and have worth. If not, we may spend much of our adult lives seeking that "good enough" mirroring. Yet, here we are, all of us, isolated and alone. Far too many of us are without that good enough mirroring that helps us stay grounded and centered in love and compassion. The typical pastoral response to this sort of crisis is to remind you that God loves you, that God knows you are of infinite worth, of infinite value, that you are cherished and loved much more than you can ever know. All of this is true and it is easy to say. It requires nothing of us but good verbiage.

As Church, we go beyond good verbiage. We go beyond saying the right thing. We work on becoming the loving, kind, good enough people that God created us to be. This is why we engage in intentional spiritual practices and community mental health practices. We let people know that they matter when we practice listening deeply. We let people know that they are welcome when we create spaces that enable them to participate fully. We let people know that we care when we take the time to sit with them as they work through their thoughts.

All of this is really hard to do when we are isolating for the good of the community. I see and hear people talking about how hard it is to be alone or to be in homes which aren't very supportive. Knowing that there are people out there who are struggling to remain grounded and centered in the knowledge that they are loved and they are worthy of love is a call to action for the Church. The difficulty we have in answering this call is doing so while staying at home, safe and sound. The Church is not one to be stopped by this though. We are living witnesses and we can be creative in thinking about how we can reach out.

We have begun having a zoom fellowship at 10 a.m. on Sundays following worship. We have been sending out letters and cards. We've been making phone calls and dropping off pre-recorded CD's of the worship service. We've been reaching out to members of our community to record music and scriptures so that they can participate in our worship service. We have continued to give of our resources to support the ongoing work of the church. We've been reaching out to other churches and community leaders to work together to identify and meet the needs of our community. We've been sewing masks and making them available to those in need. We've been baking cookies and sharing them (without any physical contact!).

In so many ways we continue to be Church to one another. We are a practicing church, not an intellectual exercise but a community of believers who come together to support one another in very real and tangible ways. We are a church that seeks to live as disciples of Christ, allowing our desire to be closer to God to transform us, reform us, and recreate us. May it be so,

FINANCE REPORT 1 ST QUARTER

Income: \$34,149.00 Expenses: \$42,261.01 Shortage: \$7,690.05

Our church members have been good stewards of the church funds over the years so we are in good financial shape to weather this crisis.

It is important to remember as a congregation that we continue the financial support of our church during this challenging time. Even though the church is physically closed for weekly worship, behind the scenes "business as usual" continues. That means we have salaries to pay our employees, utility bills that need to get paid, missions that we support, and so on. You can continue to make your offering via mail by sending your check to: First Presbyterian, 258 Lodi St., Lodi, WI 53555, or, we have our online donation option (below). This option is ideal during these times as there is no potential of passing along any germs which can live on surfaces such as paper, cardboard, etc. We also ask that you do not drop any payments off directly at the church.

GIVING MADE EASIER!

First Presbyterian now offers online giving. We have an account set up with the Presbyterian Foundation and Vanco Financial so that you have more options to make your church donations. You can either do this via computer by selecting the 'Give Now' button below, or by using the GivePlus Mobile App which you can find by searching GivePlus Church in your app store. STIMULUS CHECKS

Easter blessings to you all in this most unusual Easter season. Many of you have already or will soon receive a government stimulus check as part of the Federal government CARES Act. A government action to offer relief in this difficult time.

This money could prove helpful to many and/or a means of offering help to others. I commend self-care and generosity to one and all. But I know it also raises questions for some such as myself. Should I set aside a portion for taxes next year? Will I get to keep it, or will I need to refund some or all of it? Here is some advice from Dave Hatz, our JKP Treasurer and professional Financial planner and Tax preparer:

The stimulus checks are not taxable and will be treated as a tax credit on people's 2020 tax return. If you as a single taxpayer earn less than \$75,000.00 you will get to keep the entire amount. If you file jointly as a couple, the cutoff is \$150,000.00. If you make more than that you will need to return a portion based on your income. Once you attain the level of \$99,000.00 as a single taxpayer or \$198,000.00 as a couple filing jointly you will return the entire amount of the credit. The upper limit increases \$10,000.00 for each dependent child. The figure used for these calculations is your "Adjusted Gross Income" listed on your Tax Return.

While it is possible that the government may make changes in the months ahead, this is the situation as it currently stands. Please use this advice when making your plans for how to use your stimulus check.
