The worship service will be transmitted via speakers and via your car radio. You can choose to stay seated in your car, or bring a lawn chair and sit in the designated area. Please use face masks and maintain six feet of distance between anyone who is not immediate family.

WORSHIP RETURNING INDOORS

While nothing is certain at this time when it comes to Covid19, we do know that we cannot continue our parking lot worship service once the weather turns cooler. While we plan to continue outdoor services through September, we are going to set a date of Sunday, October 4th to return worship services indoors. Exciting, right!? That being

said, we do understand that this doesn't mean business as usual. There will be precautions and protocols to follow in order to return safely indoors. Session will be creating a "do and don't list" of guidelines that everyone will need to follow when worship returns indoors. A specific list will be sent out prior to October 1st, however, here some of the changes you can anticipate:

- Face masks required
- Hand sanitizing
- Social distancing
- Assigned seating (by family members within your Covid circle) This will require knowing in advance who is in your circle
- Dedicated entrance and exit strategy
- No fellowship following service (except in parking lot)

This is a work in progress and we plan to have a formal document distributed prior to October 1st outlining specifics. We're excited to reach this benchmark during a difficult time, and barring any changes in the current Covid climate to the contrary, we look forward to seeing everyone indoors!

My Friends,

We gather every Sunday and multiple times during the week because we are Christians, seeking to know and follow the way that Jesus taught. Everything we do is wrapped in and supported by the values, words, and actions of Jesus Christ. It is my fondest wish that this choice to embrace the values and the Way of Jesus would extend to our daily lives. This is what it means to be a disciple.

Yet there are many conflicting and popular values and beliefs that we experience in our daily lives. These values are those which speak violence to the most vulnerable among us, which assuage our regret about not speaking up and not acting. Which tell us to seek our own good even at the cost of injury to others. Lest I sound too preachy or self righteous let me assure you that I know these values well. I too hear their call. So did Jesus. He heard their call when he wandered in the desert alone and hungry. The values and beliefs which admonish us to seek our own safety, to establish our power and authority, to seek our good at the expense of others, that we can be OK even if our neighbor is not, or that we can know we are good because we have deemed others as less than—these values have been with us since the dawn of time. They are not Christian values.

As Christians we are called to love one another, to love our neighbor, even if, especially if, our neighbor does not agree with us, does not look like us, does not share a common history with us or can do nothing for us. It was this act of caring for and loving those who were the least among us that marked the early Christian church, as they willingly entered plague houses and cared for those who were ill, as they fed the hungry without asking what's in it for me, or are you worthy. It was this act of selfless love of standing with those on the margins of society that caused the whole world to stand astonished and say, "See how they love?"

Our world always stands in need of this love, a love that affirms that we are created in the image of God. Created in relationship, for relationship, by Love for love. Our Christian values; humility, self-giving love, healing the sick, feeding the hungry, reconciling the estranged, including the disenfranchised, supporting the flourishing of life, all of this is needed for the healing and well being of our world. The arc of our scriptures is always that of God acting to correct our behavior and choices, our values, from that those which are self-serving and self-interested, to those which are other-focused and self-giving. God calls the good out of us and asks us to live from that place.

Our choices and our behaviors, especially during a time of crisis, will always illuminate our values and beliefs. Are we choosing our own comfort and security? Are we embracing words that are divisive and encourage violence? Are we seeking peace and understanding? Are we seeking to know and love those vastly unlike us? How are we loving one another? How we answer the questions of this time will shine a light on what we value, what we believe. May we have the courage and tenacity to walk the Way of Jesus during this time.
